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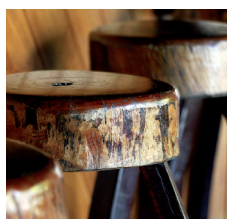
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Dining



Mulligans Bar



Named after James Venture Mulligan, 'The Prince of Prospectors' – our bar is located in the Main Lodge.

Discoverer of the Palmer River of Gold in 1873, and a prodigious and popular explorer of this part of Far North Queensland. A contemporary said:

'Jim Mulligan was not an adventurer in the ordinary sense. He was not a swashbuckler and he was not a swindler. He was too conventional for the first and too honest for the latter....Robert Logan Jack speaks of Mulligan's personal charm, his humanity, his kind big heart and his persistency in the face of difficulty. He was well educated, and with the fine manner that sits so well upon the Irishman who will believe that the world loves him, and that if it has a grievance it is not wilfully imposed. The sense of mateship shone through in all Mulligan's words and actions. This trait in the Australian character was forged on the early goldfields among the diggers and was found among all Australian bushmen of frontier days. Without it, the handful of men who faced an unknown land would not have survived. Where mateship broke down and discord crept in, as it did among Leichardt and his men, they perished.

If two men upon a handshake, agreed to stand by each other, come what may, they were as powerful as an army. The mateship shown years later in wartime was born in Australia's pioneer days'.

Guests are asked to book either the night before or the morning of as some extra preparation is entailed.

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
